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Program Concept and Objectives: The Insurance industry is adopting internet technology in marketing insurance of products. In the course of business it also preserves the information and personal data of policyholders. Nowadays, digital technologies have made it easier than ever before to track and profile consumer behaviour. It has become increasingly important to examine how the privacy of consumers and the protection of their personal data can be ensured during the consumer journey across the banking and insurance sectors. It is therefore essential to establish a relationship of digital trust between insurance companies and its consumers.

The importance of the landmark judgement of the Supreme Court of India in the "Puttaswamy case" in August 2017, in laying down that the right to privacy is a Fundamental Right protected under the Constitution of India, which is considered the precursor of the DPDP Act 2023. The judgement recognized that this right is extended to the protection of personal information. This would mean that Insurance policyholders in India are guaranteed constitutional protection of their data privacy. Following the notification of the DPDP Act, 2023, IRDAI set up a task force to evaluate how the new data protection laws affect the insurance industry and observed the need for protecting policyholder information in four dimensions: consent, usage, access, and disclosure.

In this context, the College of Insurance has designed this program to provide a better understanding of data usage, its protection and security to insurers and others involved in managerial roles.

- The role and responsibilities of Insurers in data protection
